



## **Two Holes-in-One Make Duncaster Golf Tournament an Event to Remember**

Aug. 31, 2009 – In something of a historic moment, two golfers each made hole-in-ones on the same hole at last week's Duncaster first charity golf tournament. "This is the first time we've had two hole-in-ones during a tournament," says Wintonbury Hills Golf Course General Manager, Doug Juhasz.

Golfers Nick Foligno and Tom Landry not only got the satisfaction of making those hole-in-ones, they also both earned one of tournament's prizes --golfing vacations at Newport Dunes in Texas. There were prizes for anyone who got a hole-in-one on one of four selected holes. Both men got their aces on the 12<sup>th</sup> hole. *Golf Digest* puts the odds of an average player making an ace at 12,000 to 1.

"I like the fact that we made course history at our very first charity golf tournament," says Michael O'Brien, Duncaster's President and Chief Executive Officer. "I'm also pleased that the tournament raised over \$ \$40,000 for the Duncaster Community Fund and the Duncaster Community Outreach Fund." The Duncaster Community Fund provides programs and services to Duncaster residents and the Duncaster Community Outreach Fund supports local social service organizations and community projects.

Over 125 Duncaster residents, staff members and vendors played in the tournament, competing for the low gross foursome, the low net foursome, the longest drive, and closest to the pin, in addition to the four hole-in-one contests. Prizes were awarded at the dinner that followed the day-long event.

"The only down-side to having such a successful tournament is that it's going to be hard to beat next year," says O'Brien. "But I'm confident our staff and volunteers are up to the challenge."
