

SPOTS STILL OPEN FOR GOLFERS AND SPONSORS OF DUNCASTER 'S CHARITY GOLF EVENT

Aug. 25 event to benefit older adults and local service organizations

BLOOMFIELD, CT, July 5, 2009 – Local golfers looking for a way to play Bloomfield's newest course and benefit the community still have time to sign up for Duncaster's first charity golf tournament on Tuesday, August 25. Proceeds from the event will benefit the Duncaster Community Fund which provides programs and services to Duncaster residents and the Duncaster Community Outreach Fund which supports local social service organizations and community projects.

Duncaster's first charity golf tournament will be held at Wintonbury Hills Golf Course on Terry Plains Road in Bloomfield. Tournament participants will get lunch, cocktails and dinner as part of their registration for the tournament. Registration starts at noon, followed by lunch and a shotgun (scramble format) starting at 1:00 p.m. There will be prizes for the low gross foursome, the low net foursome, the longest drive, and closest to the pin. Dinner will follow play at approximately 6:00 p.m. and will feature prizes and raffles.

Sponsorship packages are also still available. They range from \$5000 to \$250. Packages from \$5000 to \$1000 include participation in the tournament, lunch, cocktails and dinner as well as ads in the program book and on-course signage. There are also opportunities to sponsor lunch, dinner, cocktails, and golf carts for \$1000 and \$750. These include signage at the event and participation in the non-golfing activities. Those wishing to act as range sponsors for \$500 get signage and two guests for lunch. Tee sponsors (\$250) get signage and dinner for one. The cost for individual players is \$175 and includes 18 holes with a cart, lunch, cocktails and dinner.
